## The Linden Fund, USA Announces: Multilateral School Scholarship Program

he Linden Fund, USA (LFU) is pleased to announce the recipients of the *Anthony S. Tim Scholarship Fund* at the Christianburg Wismar Secondary School, also known as the Multilateral School. Ruth Ann Mitchell of Blueberry Hill, Wismar and Trison Browne of Manni Street, Mackenzie are the first winners of the annual G\$10,000 scholarship, recently announced by Headmistress Gwendalyne George-Albert. I believe that students need to be encouraged and this scholarship can serve to encourage kids to work harder in school, as I was encouraged by my uncle's generosity. I am extremely grateful for all the doors that my uncle's assistance opened for me and I am pleased to do a small part in giving back something to others."

Mr. Bacchus has sponsored, for several years, the Bertie Bacchus Scholarship Fund at No. 5 Primary School, W.C. Berbice, where he attended primary school and was a teacher before working in the Guyana Civil Service.
